Fox Cubs—Pre-School Update

As we have been learning about people who help us, we had an exiting visit from a lovely police officer! The children had the opportunity to explore the police car, with everyone taking turns sitting inside. We looked at the important equipment police officers keep in their car, and even go to hear the loud sirens! We then talked about how police officers help us and keep us safe. The children were very curios and asked wonderful questions. They also enjoyed trying on different police outfits. After the visit we extended our learning through play by turning our role play into police. The children explored fingerprints activities and created their own police name badges.

We have been carrying out a fun experiment and created our own paint. We used cornflour, water and food colouring.

The children were actively involved in the process, helping to scoop, pour and mix the ingredients together.

Once the paint was ready, the children used their creativity to create their own unique pictures!



Hedgehogs Class Update

This week we have really got stuck into our writing, with lots of enthusiasm across the class. Those attending Drawing Club have especially loved exploring the story *The Giant Jam Sandwich*. Year 1 and Year 2 also really enjoyed the story *The Bear and the Piano* and had lots of fun writing their own versions of the story, with some children choosing to make creative changes to the original. Everyone then had the chance to make (and eat!) their very own jam sandwich, which was, of course, really yummy.

In Maths, Year 2 have finished their learning on money. Practising using money in real-life situations would really help to reinforce this learning as they now move on to multiplication and division. Reception are continuing to compare numbers to 5 and are making great progress with this. Year 1 have completed their work on numbers to 20 and are now beginning their learning on addition and subtraction.

Wildtribe was lots of fun this week as we made our own bird feeders. We scooped out oranges, mixed bird seed with lard, and added string ready to hang them up. We can't wait to see which birds come to visit us at school.

The highlight of our week was an extra PE lesson where we played dodgeball. It was great fun and a fantastic opportunity to show our teamwork skills. Everyone took losing really well, and Miss Wakley was very proud of us.




Otter Class Update




